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FAQ ABOUT CT

FYI Did you know that CT scans take the idea of conventional X-ray imaging to a new level. Instead of finding the outline of bones and organs, a CT scan machine forms a full three-dimensional computer model of a patient's insides. Doctors can even examine the body one narrow slice at a time to pinpoint specific areas.

How should I prepare for my CT exam?

In preparation for a CT scan, be prepared to provide us with a list of any current medications you may be taking. Women should always notify their physician if there is any chance of their being pregnant. Contrast material may be injected intravenously and administered by mouth in order to increase the distinction between various organs or areas of the body.

If the patient has a history of allergy to contrast material (such as iodine), the requesting physician and radiologist should be notified. All metallic materials and certain clothing around the body are removed 🔢 our front office. Her com- 🔛 because they can interfere with the clarity of the images. You will receive your preparation instructions for your exam when the exam is scheduled.

Will the radiation that I receive from the CT scan hurt me?

During the CT scan, you are briefly exposed to radiation. Your physician believes that CT scans provide enough valuable information to outweigh the associated risks.

A CT scan can be used to study all parts of your body, such as the chest, abdomen, pelvis, or an arm or leg. It can take pictures of body organs, such as the liver, pancreas, intestines, kidneys, bladder, adrenal glands, sinuses, lungs, and heart.
